Language differences between men and women are influenced by a variety of factors

Gender communication tendencies:

- Not Static
- Fluid

Gender-Based Misunderstandings

1. Showing Support

 Both assume the other should say more, when they do, it is not what the other expected

2. Troubles Talk

 Both misinterpret the intentions of the other, both get offended

3. The Point of the Story

 Men find women's stories wandering & tedious, women find men's stories to be lacking interesting detail

4. Relationship Talk

 When someone wants to talk, men think there's a problem, women think there is no problem

5. Public Speaking

 Double standard, successful women need to be both masculine and feminine, successful men need only to be masculine
