Michael Kimmel "Masculinity as Homophobia"

- Thesis: Fear of being ridiculed as too feminine perpetuates exclusionary masculinity
 - Solution: Inclusionary/broadened definition of 'manhood'
- Claim: Manhood is socially constructed
 - Constantly being played out, acted upon, reasserted and over time, redefined
 - Ability to be shifted and changed encompass much larger definition
 - Does NOT have to be rooted in:
 - Insecurity
- o Opposition to anything NOT seen as
- Competition
- pinnacle of macho manliness
- Claim: Masculinity = homosocial enactment = competition/show
 - Built up in G-action & G-language
 - Exaggerated to hide signs of so called weakness
 - Defines feminine = opposition
 - Everything NOT viewed as pure masculinity = lower on the hierarchical scale
 - Scale = put in place as measurement of [HEGEMONIC] masculinity
 - Includes everything that is NOT male, white, heterosexual, middle/upper-class, physically & mentally abled
- Claim: Homophobia = root of masculinity = fear of being emasculated
 - Informs racism/sexism
 - Causes silence, insecurity, fear, shame, & isolation within/amongst men
- Claim: Violence = used as clear & very visible sign of masculinity
 - "Othered" groups = always in contention with the definition of pure masculinity [over history this has shifted]
 - Faulty Assumption: because men as a group hold power, individual men must feel powerful
 - Contradiction symmetry between public/ private or social/psychological reality RARELY exists
 - Paradox many men live with men benefit greatly from institutional power but do not necessarily feel individually empowered
- Claim: Desire/insurmountable need to be viewed masculine affect all areas of society
 - Escape/exclusion = often used by men to keep/regain power
 - Create change = the silence MUST be broken → form allies w/ people regardless of gender, sexuality, race, class, ability, etc
