Feminist Response to the Social Construction of Gender

Goal: Challenge Heteronormativity

Competing Theories/Movements: G = Biological? Cultural? [disagreement]

- ESSENTIALISM: S = G = SY
 - Problems:
 - Does not allow sex to be a utility of pleasure [only reproduction]
 - Does not allow for G = Socially Constructed [or G-roles = artificial]
 O Instead, these are all fixed & determined
 - Does not allow for resistance of oppressions [state of being = natural]

• PHENOMENOLOGY: Embodiment + S-diff

- Problems:
 - Does not allow for the BODY = Socially Constructed
 - Alienates Transsexuals = reinforcing S/G-binary
 - Should be viewed as an intersection of oppression (G & SY)
 - Reduces G-diff to power relations No subject, just structure

• MASCULINITIES: Multiple

• **Problem:** Hierarchy of masculinity is not just about M & F, but also Gays/Lesbians

How can we account for MULTIPLICITY & SUBJECTIVITY w/out falling into RELATIVISM?

Phil Petrie 'Real Men Don't Cry... And Other "Uncool" Myths'

• M = Cultural Roles & Expectations

- Rational/Objective & Devoid of strong emotions
 - Assumption: the later will interfere with the former
 - Result: "Man" = "Cool" [emotionless]
- **Problem:** Asking M to share emotion = asking them to redefine their ID
 - Communication = key to healthy life & relationships
 - Being "cool" = persona [NOT a person]
- Why so difficult?
 - If M don't know/won't admit how they feel, they cannot talk about them
 - SC has created a **fear** of sharing = vulnerability
 - Racial issue: already lack of power/control
 Giving up cool = losing survival mechanism
 - **Paradox:** Teach M to be strong, ask them to show emotion, & then cast-off as weak
 - Result: Internalization & Unhealthy expressions of emotion
 - Ex: using sex as an outlet
- **Conclusion:** Normative we ought not expect/encourage M to go through life in silence
